PHYSICALS

- Required by law for all members every year
- Must be submitted before participating in rehearsals
- Forms and upload link can be found on our website

NO PASS NO PLAY

House Bill 72 - this is a state law - not a district policy

If a class is failed, the student:

- Cannot participate in extracurricular activities
- Must still attend all marching band rehearsals
- Can regain eligibility, and the right to participate, but must be passing ALL classes. It is often too late for re-entry into the competitive show, but participation with the band is still expected.

The opportunity for weekly performance is a motivating factor for academic achievement for marching band students, since only by maintaining their eligibility can they continue to perform. As a result, the directors have documented the fact that the least number of ineligible band students during the year occurs during the marching season.

WHAT ARE BAND BOOSTERS?

The Band Boosters is a non-profit organization comprised of **ALL** parents/guardians of band students that exists to support the operations of the band, including the Panther Regiment. Specifically during the marching season, the Band Boosters oversee:

- -feeding the students before football games and on competition days
- -securing volunteers for events
- -contributing financially to support the mission/events of the band

WHERE CAN I VOLUNTEER?

As you can see, it takes a lot of volunteers to support such a great band!

We understand and support that everyone's available time to volunteer is different.

Some volunteer positions are better served by people who can make a regular commitment to serve every game in the same position.

Other positions are more simple and can be done by any person who can only volunteer once or twice a season.

Most volunteer positions require a combination of people who can help regularly as well as those who can only help once or twice.

VERY LITTLE TIME:

- -Plumes/Mirrors
- -Flip Books during half time show
- -Icee Pops during marching practice
- -Uniform washing
- -Water jug volunteers

A LITTLE MORE TIME:

- -Bus chaperones
- -Merchandise Table
- -Feed the Regiment

EVEN MORE TIME:

- -Pushing Props on Field
- -Loading/Unloading the truck
- -Pushing Pit Equipment on the Field
- -Concession
- -Serve on the Booster Board

FOOTBALL GAME VOLUNTEERS BY SECTIONS

Starting the 2023 marching season, each section will be assigned a football game. Parents/guardians/family members of those sections are asked to make sure all volunteer spots for the concession stand are filled for that game. Any spots needing to be filled will be the responsibility of the section for that week.

It is important that every family has a least one or two people that fill out the KISD Volunteer Form. This form becomes available toward the middle of June on the KISD website and is required to be a volunteer around students.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

BOOSTER FEES

The new membership fee of \$50/family is an important element in supporting the band program through the year. The Panther Regiment is growing in both size and success. The Boosters are a support system that help handle many tasks so directors can focus their attention on the students. We also supplement the rising costs of developing an award winning band program. The membership fees along with fundraisers enable the Boosters to pay for items such as truck rental and fuel for traveling, prop building, Band Banquet, Senior Scholarships, meals during marching competitions and other costs not covered by district funding.

The Boosters also help collect fees for marching band supplies and meals as outlined in the next few slides.

BOOSTER LEVELS

- \$50 LEVEL (minimal required level)
- -Competition Meals for one student (additional students are \$40 each to cover meals)
- -Car Decal
- \$75 LEVEL (includes a \$25 donation)
- -Competition Meals for one student (additional students are \$40 each to cover meals)
- -Car Decal
- -Portrait Button
- \$100 LEVEL (includes a \$50 donation)
- -Competition Meals for one student (additional students are \$40 each to cover meals)
- -Car Decal
- -Portrait Button
- -Yard Sign

MARCHING BAND SUPPLIES

Each Regiment member must purchase items that must be worn with the marching uniform. This includes a water jug, competition shirt, practice shirt, shorts, gloves, and black marching shoes. In 2022 it cost around \$150 to purchase the minimum of all items without including extras or optional add-ons. These items are ordered in May or August online through the boosters. Opportunities are available to try items on before purchasing to make sure the correct size is ordered. These items can be reused each year as long as they remain in good condition.

MEALS

COMPETITION MEALS: This is a required fee that pays for the students to be fed on competition days. Competition Meals for one student are covered in Booster Fees. For families with multiple band students, each additional student is \$40 each.

GAME DAY MEALS: This is an optional fee that allows you to purchase meals for your student to eat after school but before the football game. This fee is paid to the Boosters and in 2022 it was \$110.

Students are not allowed to go home between school and football games, so if Game Day Meals are not purchased, a meal must be brought up to the student at 4:00pm.
